Hello-

I'm writing to let you know that the City of Rehoboth Beach has increased its gross receipts rental tax rate from 6% to 7%. The Board of Commissioners voted reluctantly but unanimously February 16 to adopt this increase as part of efforts to close a potential more than \$4 million deficit in the city's 2025 fiscal year budget, which begins April 1.

The new 7% rental receipts tax rate will be effective on all rental contracts entered into on or after April 1, 2024. The city's 2024 gross receipts rental tax form, which will be mailed to you, will allow for reporting receipts at both the 6% and 7% rates.

We know that no one likes cost increases, but I want to assure you that commissioners felt this increase was necessary to help achieve the city's commitment to attracting and retaining highly qualified staff members in order to provide outstanding service to our community and visitors. Commissioners also are committed to ensuring that the burden of additional costs are shared as equitably as possible among all city stakeholders, visitors and property owners alike.

In addition to raising the rental tax rate, commissioners voted last week to increase the hourly meter parking rate from \$3 to \$4/hour in season, May 15-September 15. Parking permit fees also increased about 30% across the board. You can find the new parking permit rates online at cityofrehoboth.com/parking-information/parking-permits. Finally, commissioners are expected to also consider increases to the property tax rate and wastewater rate next month at their March meetings, which are open to the public.
